Lifespan:

Red Eared Slider



Lifespan: Generally, in captivity, a red eared slider can live up to **40 to 50** years. But unfortnatly, the species has a shorter lifespan of 20 to 30 years in the wild.

Size:

A full-grown Red Eared Slider's size can be between 7 to 12 inches in length and the weight can be between 3 to 6 pounds

The map turtles can live from **15 to 100** years in captivity. One or two species of map turtle live up to 5.5 years at best in captivity

Size:

Males do not usually get quite as big as females, but their size difference is not significant.Large western painted turtles rarely exceed 8 inches in length, and southern painted turtles are not normally larger than 6 inches.

Softshell Turtle



Lifespan:

The average lifespan of a softshell turtle is around 50 years. Depending on the subspecies, the longevity can be between 11 to 400 years.

Size:

The average carapace length of an **adult female** softshell turtle can be **between 7 to 25 inches.** On the other hand, an adult male softshell turtle grows between 5 to 12 inches.

Snapping Turtle

Lifespan:

Snapping turtles generally reach maturity at 8 to 10 years and can live up to 40 years or more.

Size:

The common snapping turtle is a large turtle, ranging in size from 8 to 14 inches with a record length of 19.3 inches. Their average weights range from 10 to 35 pounds, with a record of 75 pounds
