

Bad Smell From Turtle Tank?

Follow These 10 Steps




STEP 1

Identify the Source of Odor

- Leftover food decomposing in the tank.
- Turtle waste accumulating.
- Bacterial growth in stagnant water.


STEP 2



Regular Cleaning


- Perform partial water changes weekly.
- Clean the tank thoroughly every few weeks.
- Use a siphon to clean gravel and remove waste.

STEP 3



Proper Filtration
